“This session hit very close to home, as I feel the Director and Children’s librarian do this type of thing all the time. Part of our issue in our library is space limitations, especially in the non-fiction adult area. We do not have a big readership of non-fiction and one of the compromises we have made is that much non-fiction is not purchased until a patron requests an item. If it is a new item, we will purchase, older items we offer to ILL. It has opened up some staff discussions about how to “Balance” the perspective. Our Children’s Librarian has almost swung too far. She has done a great job of expanding the collection to represent many different cultural, social ideas, BUT some of the

more conservative parents are not happy and some of this material has no circulation interest. Hits the note that this needs to be an ongoing discussion to be revisited frequently to keep our purchases representing all interest groups.”

Chapter 1 The Hyperlinked Librarian

Summary: He discusses how libraries must evolve to meet our user preferences by being “creative and curious”. The new MLS grads should have a firm foundation on project management and strategic planning. Fewer students are turning to libraries for personal and academic resources; we

need to be addressing their need for guidance on how to have a successful research project, rather than jus on the location of materials. Librarians need show by example the need to learn and grow if we are to foster these traits in our patrons

My Major Takeaways/Ideas to bring to my library

- Perhaps creating a community database of experts in any given area – people in the community being willing to be interviewed by students when doing research.**
- Advertise the YA space as a place to meet for group work, how can we make that a more hospitable place?**
- “Taking Time to Learn New Things”, I can find some time to get more proficient in downloading e-books and audio books, and perhaps finding a better way to manage our volunteers and appropriate duties.**
- To Read: “It’s Complicated: The Social Lives of networked Teens” by Danah Boyd and Library Journal Edmonton Public Library’s Outreach Program (12/4/14)**
- Having our staff develop an “Elevator Pitch” for our library, as a way to advocate to the community.”**
